ENERGETIC Durban yachtsmen are on the move again. This week-end, six or seven yachtsmen will travel to Port Shepstone for a series of races on the river.

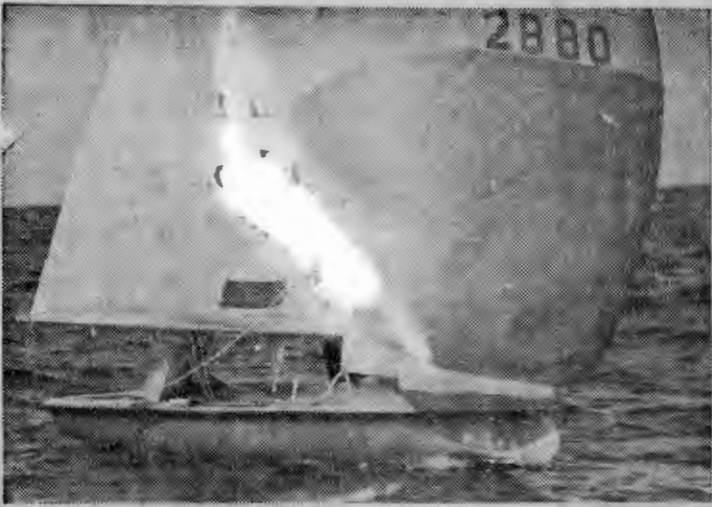
