

Vaal yachtees make history

DENEYSVILLE. - For the first time in its history the Deneysville Aquatic Club (DAC) at the Vaal Dam is the proud owner of the Interclub Trophy after three of its yachting teams excelled in this year's challenging Vasco da Gama Yacht Race.

The annually Vasco Race between Maputu and Durban, organised by the Royal Natal Yacht Club, takes place in July.

The Interclub Trophy is awarded to the club with the highest cumulative score based on their members' positions across the finishing line.

This year for the first time an inland yacht club, DAC, could manage to put salt water in the coastal clubs' eyes.

Last week the trophy was officially presented to the Commodore, Graham Brown, and the skippers of DAC's participating yachts, Enzer, Kindred Spirit and the VCR 90.6 FM.
