

# America's Cup fleet sets course for Sydney

SYDNEY — The Darling Harbour Yacht Club will host the America's Cup class world championships in 1993, club officials announced yesterday.

Up to eight international syndicates will contest a series of fleet races out of Sydney Harbour culminating in two yachts sailing a best-of-3 match-race series in the harbour on January 26.

The Darling Harbour Yacht Club-based Spirit of Australia syndicate is one of two Australian groups that will challenge for the America's Cup off San Diego next

year.

"When we win the America's Cup next year, Darling Harbour will then have the world championships in 1993 and again in 1994 before our defence of the cup in 1995," said Graeme Rich, commodore of the DHYC. "Darling Harbour will become America's Cup city."

The world championships will be held every non-America's Cup year, and the winner of the America's Cup earns the right to host the world championships the year preceding its cup defence. Sapa-AP.
