THE Point Yacht Club's new sailing season, which will begin at the end of this month, will open with an attractive scheme. There will be no entry fees for Sunday morning races.

Yachtsmen will be able to put in entries for the Sunday race until half an hour before starting time.

Saturday's fees, however, will be increased by five cents.

Another novelty in the new season is that club championships will be held for particular classes during some of the races.

There will also be an open handicap race this season. This will be different to the traditional open handicap race of the year, the Johnson Cup, for it will be held in

various classes while the Johnson Cup is an "all-in."
